

#### ISAT Practice Update

We have been focusing on writing responses to a readings selection. We begin a mini unit on geometry and fractions, including angles, shapes, lines, rays, vertices, edges, polygons, and parts/whole. We will

continue with these areas this week as well as measurement!!

#### Science

Last week, we concluded our study of fish with a "Shocking Sharks" mini lesson. Be sure to ask your shark expert all about our shark facts! This week's topics include a review of fish and birds, as well as a new vertebrate group—Mammals!

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After our quick division preview

(we will come back to this in March), we started Geometry! These kiddos are doing a fabulous job—and are really enjoying it. So far, we have tackled lines, line segments, rays, points, angles, solid/plane figures, congruent, and polygons.

This week, we will study various 2D and 3D shapes. We will discuss vertices, sides, faces, bases, volume, perimeter, and area.

#### English/Writing:

We are still crazy about dialogue and idioms, but we've shifted our focus to "author's purpose" in writing.

We will also learn how to write friendly and formal letters—while focusing on punctuation and sentence structure
